



# Angola total renewables

Will Angola get 70% of its energy from renewables by 2025?

These initiatives are backed by President João Lourenço, who at COP26 in November 2021 stated that Angola aims to source 70% of its energy from renewables by 2025. The solar projects include those connected to the grid and smaller off-grid developments to electrify isolated communities in Angola.

How many MW of solar energy will be installed in Angola?

Under the agreement, Sun Africa will develop 728 MW of solar mini-grids to provide electricity to more than 2 million people in southern Angola. The investment represents the largest mini-grid energy project in Africa.

Will Angola expand its power supply by 2025?

As part of its long-term development strategy the Government of Angola (GOA) aims to expand electricity access to 60% of the population by 2025. Renewable energy (RE) will constitute 70% of the country's installed capacity (GOA 2018). Hydropower potential is huge, estimated at 18.2 GW, of which currently only 20% is exploited.

Is Angola developing a solar power project?

Angola is currently developing several solar power projects that tie in to the country's Angola Energy programme and its environmental commitments. Among current developments is a mega-project consisting of seven photovoltaic plants that will be commissioned by Q2 2023 and additional projects funded by the Angolan and US governments.

Who owns solar power in Angola?

The asset is owned, run and financed by French energy giant TotalEnergies in partnership with Sonangol and local renewables company Greentech - Angola Environment Technology. In May 2022, President Lourenço approved a contract worth USD 1.02 billion for the development of new solar projects with the aim of electrifying 60 communes.

What is Angola's energy mix?

Angola's current installed capacity is estimated at 5.7 GW but only 70 percent is in use. The country's current energy mix consists of 61.8 percent hydropower, 37.6 percent other fossil fuels and 0.6 percent hybrid (solar/fossil fuel).

Angola is a member of OPEC (Resolution 95/06, of 13 December) and in April 2023 Angola recorded 1.06 million barrels per day (bpd) of crude production, surpassing Nigeria as a top African crude oil producer. Non-official information is that Angola's new OPEC production target for 2024 is 175,000 b/d.
