Is solar PV a good option for Brazil's energy mix?

Brazil's 2050 National Energy Plan (NEP 2050) outlines the importance of solar pv for Brazil's energy mix. Solar power has become a competitive alternative as a renewable source of energy and can help the country meet its commitments to reduce greenhouse gases, the report says.

Does Brazil have solar energy?

Solar energy has great potential in Brazil, with the country having one of the highest levels of insolation in the world at 4.25 to 6.5 sun hours/day. As of 2019, Brazil generated nearly 45% of its energy, or 83% of its electricity, from renewable sources. For example, 60% of Brazil's electricity generation came from renewable hydropower.

How many solar power systems will Brazil have in 2024?

Brazil expects to have 1.2 million solar power generation systems in the year 2024. Solar energy has great potential in Brazil, with the country having one of the highest levels of insolation in the world at 4.25 to 6.5 sun hours/day. As of 2019, Brazil generated nearly 45% of its energy, or 83% of its electricity, from renewable sources.

How many solar PV contracts are there in Brazil?

Solar PV participates for the first time in the Leilão de Energia Nova A-4 auction, resulting in 20 large-scale solar PV power contracts. Solar PV reaches its first gigawatt (GW) of cumulative installed capacity in Brazil!

Who invests in solar PV projects in Brazil?

Unlike wind power, the primary investment in solar PV projects in Brazil is driven by private entities.

Why is solar power important in Brazil?
