

How far apart should a bedside locker be?

Spacing: The ideal spacing between bedside lockers and a bed will be determined by its function. If you want to have items within arm's reach, then it is recommended that you place the locker approximately one to two inchesaway from the bed. On the other hand, if your locker is purely for aesthetic purposes, it can be placed further away.
