Is there a fuel shortage in the Cocos Keeling Islands?

Viva Energy is responsible for the delivery of fuel to Cocos Keeling Islands, Australia's most remote community, and an unfortunate series of events late last year has led to a shortage of premium unleaded fuelon the islands. Viva Energy has been actively working on alternative supply solutions.

Why did Viva Energy stock-out Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

Viva Energy is responsible for the delivery of fuel to Cocos (Keeling) Islands. The company said a series of unfortunate events had led to the fuel shortage. "The issues that led to the stock-out include urgent and unexpected maintenance of tankage used to supply fuel to the island," they said.

When will fuel be delivered to Cocos Islands?

On December 16 the Cocos (Keeling) Islands community, in the Indian Ocean, was notified the islands had run out of unleaded petrol. The islands are 2,750km north of Perth. The popular tourist destination is expected to receive a fuel delivery on January 29.

What is the economy like in Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

While the nearby territory of Christmas Island has a diverse economy with phosphate mining and government industries employing the majority of its residents, the Cocos (Keeling) Islands economy is almost completely reliant on tourism. Cocos (Keeling) Islands have become a popular tourist destination for West Australians.

Which ocean current flows near Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The main ocean currents in the vicinity of Cocos (Keeling) Islands are the Indonesian Throughflow, which flows in a westerly direction to the south of the islands, and the South Java Current. Observations over the last 50 years indicate a reduction in the strength of the Indonesian Throughflow.

How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands consist of two separate coral atolls, 24 km apart, which have formed atop an old volcanic seamount that rises from a depth of 5,000 m in the north-eastern Indian Ocean. Bathymetric research shows that the islands" foundations are actually two of a series of undersea features known as the Vening Meinesz Seamounts.

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands consist of two flat, low-lying coral atolls with an area of 14.2 square kilometres (5.5 sq mi), 26 kilometres (16 mi) of coastline, a highest elevation of 5 metres (16 ft) and thickly covered with coconut palms and other ...
