

Where is Bouvet Island?

Bouvet Island (/ˈbuːveɪ /BOO-vay; Norwegian: Bouvetøya [bʰvø̯e̯ə]) is an uninhabited island and dependency of Norway. It is a protected nature reserve. It is a subantarctic volcanic island, situated in the South Atlantic Ocean at the southern end of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, and is the world's most remote island.

How big is Bouvet Island?

Bouvet Island (called Bouvetøya in Norwegian) is 49 square kilometers in area. About a quarter of this is taken up by a caldera, called Wilhelmplataet. The highest point of the island is on the caldera rim, Olavtoppen, at 780 meters; it was climbed for the first time only in 2012. The ice-filled caldera itself is 250 meters below the rim.

How do you find Bouvet Island?

Find yourself a globe (for younger readers, this is a historical version of Google Earth without a zoom), and locate Bouvet Island. You will find it where the Atlantic Ocean and the Southern Ocean meet (a magnifying glass may be required). Draw a circle around it (permission from the owner of the globe should be sought).

How did Bouvet Island become a dependency?

The expedition carried out aerial photography of the island and was the first Antarctic expedition to use aircraft. : 64 The Dependency Act, passed by the Parliament of Norway on 27 February 1930, established Bouvet Island as a Norwegian dependency, along with Peter I Island and Queen Maud Land.

Is Bouvet a volcano?

All deep-ocean islands are volcanic in nature. And because islands erode pretty fast, they tend to be younger volcanoes which are still active or slightly dormant. Bouvet is a shield volcano in the final stage of its life above water. The caldera shows that there have been significant eruptions in the past!

Is Bouvet Island a UNESCO World Heritage Site?

Through an accident of history, related to whaling, Bouvet Island is now a Norwegian possession. You wouldn't have guessed, although the climate does provide a hint. It is a UNESCO World Heritage site, an honour it shares with Mount Etna, the Hawaiian and the Kamchatka's volcanoes. But you will be hard-pressed to find the visitor centre.

The island is named after Jean-Baptiste Charles Bouvet de Lozier who first spotted it in January 1739. He was on the hunt for a large southern land mass and assumed Bouvet Island was part of it. At the time he was unable to navigate around it, so was unaware that it was an island. He named it Cap de la Circoncision.

Site description (2001 baseline) Bouvetøya rises to 780 m a.s.l. (Olavtoppen) and is bounded by steep

slopes on the northern, western and south-western sides, with narrow beaches. Permanent ice covers 93% of the island, leaving only a few ice-free areas along the coast. The largest such area is Nyrsya, which was formed between 1955 and 1958, probably by a large landslide.

Bouvet Island is a remote, uninhabited island in the South Atlantic and is considered the most isolated island in the world. It is a dependent territory of Norway and covers an area of around 49 square kilometers. This land mass is just over 6 times the size of the island of Wangerøge. The total length of the coastline is 30 km.

Bouvet Island is known as the most remote island in the world; Antarctica, over 1600 kilometers (994 miles) to the south, is the nearest land mass. Located near the junction between the South American, African, and

Antarctic tectonic plates, the island is mostly formed from a shield volcano--a broad, gently sloping cone formed by thin, fluid lavas& #8212;that is ...
