How can educational radio and television help children?

Educational radio and television can support the millions of children who lack access to the internet or have low digital literacy. The effectiveness of these approaches is increased when programming encourages child and caregiver interaction. This can be enabled by SMS and other messaging tools.

Can a radio learning programme help out-of-school students learn?

In many low-resource contexts, a radio learning programme for out-of-school students means more students can learn, compared to using a TV- or internet-based solution. Simple audio-based lessons can be developed to reach and support learning in the home. Research and insight

Should you use micro lessons?

Whenever there's a large body of material that includes lots of complex,interrelated parts,micro lessons may not be suitable. To use history as an example,micro lessons could be used to help students learn lots of smaller events that happen during a specific timeframe.

Should microlessons be designed for the convenience of teachers?

Microlessons are short; therefore, the design of teaching strategies and the arrangement of teaching content should be based on applicability, ease of use and attractiveness to learners. Microlessons should not be designed for the convenience of the teachers.

How can educational TV material be delivered in low-income contexts?

In low-income contexts, educational television material could be delivered through videos played in schoolsthat are supported by corresponding teacher guidance (e.g. the Mexican school-based Telesecundaria programme), or broadcast on public channels (e.g. the Tanzanian animation, Ubongo Kids).
