What is solar panel lamination?

Solar panel lamination is the process that bonds the layers that make up a solar panel. The components used to make a solar panel are as follows in the order as shown below. This is commonly referred to as the lay-up. The lay-up above us usually finished off with a metal frame. This finishes the module off and creates stability for the unit.

One key factor in guaranteeing solar module performance and indeed longevityis the lamination process responsible for making them. This process encapsulates solar cells in between a number of substrate layers including top and bottom protective layers.

How to laminate solar panels?

As solar panels are exposed and subject to various climatic impact factors, the encapsulation of the solar cells through lamination is a crucial step in traditional solar PV module manufacturing. At this moment, the most common way to laminate a solar panel is by using a lamination machine.

The lamination of PV modules is most frequently carried out using a vacuum-membrane laminator with a single heating plate (Fig. 5) and a typical process based on three main steps.
