

Can thin-film silicon photovoltaics be used for solar energy?

The ability to engineer efficient silicon solar cells using a-Si:H layers was demonstrated in the early 1990s 113, 114. What are the components of a solar panel?

The primary components of a solar panel are its solar cells. P-type or n-type solar cells mix crystalline silicon, gallium, or boron to create silicon ingot. When phosphorus is added to the mix, the cells can conduct electricity. The silicon ingot is then cut into thin sheets and coated with an anti-reflective layer.
